## Being a Responsible Dog Owner

A canine companion is a wonderful addition to a home and with Spring in the air, residents will be spending more time outside with their dogs. Please be considerate of others and exercise good judgment when out with your dog. The Village of Riverside requires all dogs to have a Village issued license tag and to wear a collar at all times. Dog tags must be purchased once a dog reaches six months of age and annually thereafter prior to June 30. Dog license renewals will be mailed out in mid May.

Please also keep the following in mind:

- When walking your dog, your dog **MUST** be on a leash. Letting your dog walk unleashed does not allow you any control over your animal. Other people do not know your dog and should feel safe when out enjoying our village. Similarly, dogs must be on a leash if on private property but accessible to the public. (on a front porch, in the front yard, etc.)
- Dogs are not permitted on Village tennis courts, baseball fields or tot lots. This is a matter of public health and safety.
- Dog owners are required to immediately remove excrement left by their dog from any public way or property not owned by the dog owner.
- Owners of dogs who bark excessively may be fined from \$25—\$100 per day.

## Improve the Value, Comfort, and Energy Savings of your Home

Riverside single family homeowners are the first in the nation to have access to MyHomeEQ, a new online tool that can help homeowners save money and improve the value and comfort of their homes. MyHomeEQ.com provides home energy efficiency ratings and offers customized recommendations for energy saving improvements. Homeowners can also use the tool to connect with contractors and find energy efficiency rebates and other incentives.

Until April 30, Riverside homeowners can use MyHomeEQ to connect with programs from Nicor Gas that offer discounted home energy evaluations and funding to help cover the cost of energy saving home improvements. The program offers:

- **A professional home energy evaluation for only \$50.** A professional energy auditor will evaluate your home and recommend the most effective energy saving home improvements. (This service typically costs \$400 - \$600.)
- **\$40 worth of free upgrades included with the energy audit.** This includes installation of faucet aerators, an efficient shower head, and up to 10 free compact fluorescent light bulbs provided by ComEd.
- An opportunity to qualify for **funding from the Nicor Gas Energy Efficiency Program that covers 50% (up to \$1,250) of the cost of making energy-saving home improvements** recommended in the home energy evaluation.

## Building Permit Requirements

The Building department would like to remind residents that all building and construction projects, including alterations, repairs and demolitions that cost more than \$500.00, require a building permit PRIOR to work beginning. Building permit fees vary depending on the cost of the project, inspections required and plan review costs. The minimum cost is \$75.00, which covers the first \$500.00 to \$7,500.00 worth of the project's value. Permit fees increase \$15.00 for every \$1,000.00 above the initial \$7,500.00. ## Vehicle Sticker Reminder

Renewal forms will be mailed out in mid-May. Stickers must be purchased and displayed no later than June 30 to avoid penalties. Current stickers are required for all vehicles registered (with the secretary of state) to a Riverside address or housed in Riverside. Vehicles with no changes can be renewed on-line before June 20. You may also return your renewals by mail, in person, or use the silver drop box in located in front of the village office.

*New this year*, if a vehicle is to be removed from the roll, you must provide the village with a copy of the bill of sale, disposal record such as an insurance report or secretary of state registration showing that the vehicle is no longer registered in Riverside. If a vehicle remains registered in Riverside but is used out of town (such as with a college student or second home), it still must have a Riverside vehicle sticker.

## Home and Car Burglary Prevention Tips

When the weather turns warm, home and car burglaries tend to increase. Burglary is a crime of opportunity. Most thieves look for an easy target. The majority of all thefts in Riverside happen when people leave doors or windows unlocked. Don't become a victim! Make it difficult for a thief to target you by following these simple theft prevention tips:

**Keep an eye on an open garage.** Each month, patrol units report open unattended garages. It only takes a moment for criminals to remove valuable items such as golf clubs, bicycles, lawn mowers and tools. Worse yet, a thief could enter your unlocked home or steal your car. Always close your garage door unless it is within immediate sight.

**Lock and secure all doors.** Make sure you have deadbolts on all doors leading into your home. To secure sliding glass doors, install a bar or special lock.

**Secure your vehicle.** Always roll up the windows and lock your car, even when it is parked in the garage or driveway. Never leave keys or valuables, such as cell phones, computers, purses or money in plain view. Remember, if a criminal breaks into your vehicle and steals your garage door opener or house keys, he now has easy access to your home.

**Leave on the light.** It only costs "a nickel a night" to leave on your front and back outside lights. Well-lit areas deter criminals from taking advantage of the cover of darkness.

**Be aware, alert and active.** Citizen participation is essential to combat crime. Always report suspicious or unusual activity to the police. Get your neighbors together to start a Neighborhood Watch Program.
