


A Message from President Sells

COVID-19 Coronavirus Information

The United States Centers for Disease Control and Prevention advises that older adults and people who have severe underlying medical conditions like heart or lung disease or diabetes seem to be at higher risk for developing more serious complications from the COVID-19 virus. ALL RESIDENTS, especially seniors and anyone with underlying health issues, are urged to take the following steps to avoid exposure to the virus. There is currently no vaccine to prevent coronavirus disease 2019 (COVID-19). The best way to prevent illness is to avoid being exposed to this virus. The virus is thought to spread mainly from person-to-person; either between people who are in close contact with one another (within about 6 feet), or through respiratory droplets produced when an infected person coughs or sneezes.

Take steps to protect yourself and others and slow the spread

- Wash your hands often, with soap and water for at least 20 seconds, especially after you have been in a public place, or after blowing your nose, coughing, or sneezing. If soap and water are not readily available, use a hand sanitizer that contains at least 60% alcohol. Cover all surfaces of your hands and rub them together until they feel dry.
- Avoid touching your eyes, nose, and mouth with unwashed hands.
- Avoid close contact with people who are sick and keep a distance of 6 feet between yourself and others.
- Stay home if you are sick.
- Cover coughs and sneezes with tissue and immediately put the tissue in the trash.
- Clean AND disinfect frequently touched surfaces daily. This includes tables, doorknobs, light switches, countertops, handles, desks, phones, keyboards, toilets, faucets, and sinks.
- Obey shelter in place orders.

More than \$675 billion in federal funding is distributed to states and communities every year based on population counts reported during the Census. New Water & Sewer Rate

At their February 6, 2020 Regular Meeting, the Village Board of Trustees approved an ordinance increasing the water & sewer rate for the Village of Riverside. There are many factors that made this increase necessary such as increases in personnel costs including collective bargaining agreements, insurance and pension costs and the water and sewer fund paying a proportional share of administrative staff costs. The total annual bill, based on minimum usage, will increase 3.53% or \$18.60 annually. The total average annual bill is expected to increase 4.34% or \$40.92, based upon an average usage of 11 units per bimonthly bill.

Lawn Irrigation Systems

In order to meet state mandates, the Department of Public Works keeps a list of all residential properties with lawn irrigation systems (underground sprinklers). By law, any homeowner with underground lawn irrigation is required to have a reduced pressure zone (RPZ) backflow preventer valve and it must be inspected annually. This inspection insures that no contaminated water will flow back into the Village's potable water supply. Residents must obtain a permit to install an underground irrigation system. The Public Works Department will be sending out the annual inspection reminder in the coming weeks. Residents should provide the department with a copy of their current annual RPZ inspection prior to July 1, 2020.

Time to Renew Vehicle and Pet Licenses

Vehicle stickers and pet tags for 2020—2021 will soon be available. Renewal applications will be mailed mid-May. If you come to the office to purchase your stickers, **PLEASE BRING YOUR RENEWAL PAPER-WORK WITH YOU**. Residents may remit forms and payment for vehicle stickers and pet licenses in person, by mail or in the drop box in front of the Township Hall. Online renewal for vehicle licenses is also available.

If there are no changes to the vehicles for your household, please consider renewing your vehicle stickers online. There is no additional fee for processing your renewals online. Payments will be accepted online until Tuesday, June 30 at 11:59 p.m. Online renewals of vehicle stickers will begin after forms are mailed out. Residents may drop off applications and payments in the silver drop box in front of the Township Hall (no postage necessary). Payments will be accepted and considered on time as long as they have been placed in the lock

box prior to 8 a.m. on Wednesday, July 1, when the office opens for the day. Residents may also mail applications and payments to the Village. Mail must arrive prior to July 1 to avoid the \$10 late fee.

All vehicles registered to a Riverside address or housed in the village require a village vehicle sticker. A \$10 late fee will apply to all applications received after the office opens on Monday, July 1.

Online renewal of pet licenses is not available at this time. Pet licenses must be purchased at the Village Office and proof of a current ra-



bies vaccination must accompany the application. If the rabies inoculation on your pre-printed pet license renewal expires prior to June 30, 2020, please bring in proof of a current rabies inoculation.

PLEASE be a responsible pet owner. Dogs and cats must not be allowed to roam unsupervised. Pets must be on a leash when they are accessible to the public. Pet owners must clean up after their animals.
